Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of Brown County

CASA Volunteers must complete 30 hours of pre-service training which includes in person instruction and online self-paced coursework. Training covers the child welfare system, working with children who have experienced trauma and how to write an effective court report.

CASA of Brown County offers three training styles to meet your needs.

Traditional Training

Traditional training consists of 15 hours of classroom instruction plus 15 hours of independent course work online.

Flex Training

This specialized training is for those individuals with a background in social work, criminal justice, and health and human services. This training features more independent course work online and 4 hours of in-person training.

Community Champion Training

Are you with an organization or business who has five or more individuals interested in becoming a CASA Volunteer? We can host a private two-day training class just for you!
